● **Allocation of public funding for each of the positions:**

In accordance with Agreement OPLEV/CG081/2024 dated 29 March 2024, the General Council of the Local Public Body of the State of Veracruz approved the public funding to be granted to Political Parties for Campaign Expenses for the elections of Governorship and Deputies by the principle of Relative Majority in the State of Veracruz, for the Ordinary Local Electoral Process 2023-2024, as follows:

In this way, the total amount of the campaign expenditure ceiling for the Gubernatorial election would be set at \$129,621,609.47 (One hundred and twenty-nine million six hundred and twenty-one thousand six hundred and nine pesos 47/100 M.N.), referred to in the table above.

In this way, the total amount of the campaign expenditure ceiling for Deputies for the principle of relative majority would be established at \$66,279,471.1320 (Sixty-six million two hundred and seventy-nine thousand four hundred and seventy-one pesos 13/100 M.N.), as a result of the sum of the totals indicated for each of the 30 electoral districts, punctually referred to in the table above.

It is worth mentioning that Article 51.1(b)(l) of the General Law on Political Parties states that in the year of the election in which the federal or local executive branch and the two chambers of the Congress of the Union or the chamber of a state are renewed, each national or local political party, as the case may be, will be granted for campaign expenses an amount equivalent to fifty per cent of the public funding for the support of its permanent ordinary activities that corresponds to it for that year.

And, that once the arithmetic operation referred to in numeral 1 of article 51 of the General Law on Political Parties has been carried out to determine the financing for obtaining votes in electoral campaigns, which results from multiplying the amounts approved for ordinary public financing by 0.50, resulting in the aforementioned amounts.

In view of the above, this Local Public Body of the State of Veracruz does not allocate public funding for each of the popularly elected positions.

- **Limits for private funding for each of the positions:**

Pursuant to Agreement OPLEV/CG176/2023 dated 29 November 2023, the General Council of the Local Public Body of the State of Veracruz approved the determination of the limits of private funding that political parties may receive from their activists and supporters, pre-candidates and candidates, as well as the individual limit of contributions from supporters during the 2024 fiscal year, which in its operative points, which are set out below, approves the following:

"FIRST. The limits of private financing that political parties may receive during the 2023-2024 Ordinary Local Electoral Process are approved in the following terms:

- a. The annual limit that each Political Party may receive for contributions from militants, in the year 2024, is \$4,352,275.29 (Four million three hundred and fifty-two thousand two hundred and seventy-five pesos 29/100 M.N.), which may be in cash or in kind.
- b. The annual limit of the contributions that each Political Party may receive for candidacy contributions in the year 2024 is \$6,389,248.80 (Six million three hundred and eighty-nine thousand two hundred and forty-eight pesos 80/100, M.N.), which may be in cash or in kind.
- c. The annual individual limit of contributions from supporters that each Political Party may receive in the year 2024 is \$319,462.44 (Three hundred and nineteen thousand four hundred and sixty-two pesos, 44/100 M.N.), which may be in cash or in kind.

SECOND: It is approved that the sum of private financing of political parties, under all its modalities, including self-financing and financial yields, may in no case exceed the amount of public financing for the support of their permanent ordinary activities, campaign expenses and specific activities, in terms of the principle of prevalence of public over private financing.

The aforementioned is in accordance with Article 56, paragraph 2, subparagraph b) of the LGPP, as well as Article 123, paragraph 1, subparagraph b) of the Audit Regulations, which establishes that, in the case of contributions from candidates and supporters during Federal Electoral Processes, it shall be ten percent of the expenditure ceiling for the immediately preceding presidential election.

Likewise, the provisions of Article 56, paragraph 2, subsection d) of the aforementioned Law, as well as Article 123, paragraph 1, subsection d) of the Audit Regulations, establish that contributions from sympathisers will have an annual individual limit of 0.5% zero point five percent of the expenditure ceiling for the immediately preceding presidential election.

And that in relation to the provisions of Article 56, paragraph 2, subparagraphs b) and d), of the LGPP, contributions from candidates and supporters can be made during electoral processes, taking into consideration ten percent of the expenditure ceiling for the immediately preceding presidential election, as well as the annual individual limit of supporters over 0.5% zero point five percent of the aforementioned ceiling.

Therefore, in accordance with the above, this Local Public Body of the State of Veracruz only approves private funding limits for activists, supporters and candidates, and not per elected office.

● **Other prerogatives for each position:**

Article 187 of the LGIPE establishes that political parties are entitled to postal franchises as a prerogative within their public funding. In the same sense, article 45, section III of our Electoral Code establishes the right to receive them free of charge.

Article 188, paragraph 1 (a) of the LGIPE states that in election years, the total amount of postal franchises will be the equivalent of 4% (four per cent) of the public funding for ordinary activities that corresponds to political parties; likewise, paragraph (c) states that in no case will the resources destined to this prerogative be directly distributed to the parties.

On the other hand, as far as independent candidacies are concerned, Article 303 of the Electoral Code establishes that they shall enjoy postal franchises in accordance with the provisions of the LGIPE.
