Prerogatives for • Allocation of public funding for each of the positions:

By means of the Agreement IEPC-ACG-044/2023 dated 08 August 2023, the General Council of the Electoral and Citizen Participation Institute of the State of Jalisco approved the public funding to be granted to Political Parties for Campaign Expenses for the 2023-2024 Ordinary Local Electoral Process, as follows:

It is worth mentioning that the General Law on Political Parties in its Article 51, paragraph 1, subsection b), section I, states that in the year of the election in which the federal or local Executive Power and the two Chambers of the Congress of the Union or the Chamber of a federal entity are renewed, each national or local political party, if applicable, will be granted for campaign expenses an amount equivalent to fifty per cent of the public funding that corresponds to it for the support of its permanent ordinary activities in that year.

And that once the arithmetical operation referred to in numeral 1 of article 51 of the General Law of Political Parties has been carried out to determine the financing for obtaining votes in electoral campaigns, which results from multiplying the amounts approved for ordinary public financing by 0.50, resulting in the amounts mentioned above.

*In accordance with the ruling in the appeals RAP-020/2020 and its accumulated RAP-002/2024, the parties who maintained their national registration and did not receive 3% of the valid votes cast in the state's local deputies election of relative majority are eligible to run in the next local elections as long as their national registration is not revoked. They can also receive public funding for campaign expenses under Article 13, section IV, paragraph d) of the Political Constitution of the State of Jalisco, as long as they do not lose their national registration.

In view of the above, it is important to specify that this Electoral Institute does not allocate public funding for each of the popularly elected positions, but rather the percentages for allocating public funding to be received by political parties that are entitled to access it are established in the electoral regulations.



Limits on private funding for each of the positions:

In accordance with Agreement IEPC-ACG-066/2023 dated October 11, 2023, the General Council of the Electoral and Citizen Participation Institute of the State of Jalisco approved the agreement that determines the amounts of the annual limits of private funding that national political parties accredited in the state of Jalisco and local political parties may receive during the year 2024, for their members and supporters, pre-candidates and candidates, as well as the individual limit of contributions from supporters during the fiscal year 2024; in recital XII, which is set out below, the following was established:

- 1. The annual maximum amount of militant donations that each political party is allowed to accept in 2024, comprising both one-time and required contributions, as well as quotas for regular and extraordinary, monetary, or in-kind contributions provided by political party militants, which amounts to the sum of \$8,891,215.65 (Eight million eight hundred and ninety-one thousand two hundred and fifteen pesos 65/100 M.N.).
- 2. The maximum amount of contributions per year that each political party will be allowed to receive from its supporters in 2024 will be determined by the voluntary and personal contributions made by supporters during the federal and local electoral processes. This limit will be made up of cash or inkind donations made to political parties by residents of Mexico who do not fall under the provisions set forth in Article 54 of the LGPP, which amounts to the sum of \$ 2,858,834. 34 (Two million eight hundred and fifty-eight thousand eight hundred and thirty-four pesos 34/100 M.N.).
- 3. The annual maximum amount of private funding that local and national political parties recognised in the State of Jalisco are permitted to receive for the Annual Exercise of 2024 through the financing methods of militancy and sympathies, which amounts to the sum of \$11,750,049.99 (Eleven million seven hundred and fifty thousand forty-nine pesos 99/100 M.N.).



- 4. The annual individual limit, monetary or in-kind, which each supporter can make for the annual exercise in the year 2024, which amounts to the sum of \$ 142,941.71 (One hundred and forty-two thousand nine hundred and forty-one pesos 71/100 M.N.).
- 5. Political parties' total private funding, in all its forms (including self-financing and financial returns), may never surpass the amount of public funding provided to support their ongoing regular operations, campaign expenditures, and special initiatives.

Article 56, paragraph 2, subsection d) of the Law, as well as Article 123, paragraph 1, subsection d) of the Audit Regulations, establish that contributions from supporters will have an annual individual limit of 0.5 per cent of the expenditure ceiling for the immediately preceding presidential election.

Additionally, that under Article 56, paragraph 2, subparagraphs b) and d) of the LGPP, contributions from candidates and supporters are permitted during electoral processes, with 10% of the expenditure ceiling for the presidential election that came right before being taken into account, as well as an annual limit of supporters exceeding 0.5% of the aforementioned cap.

Therefore, in accordance with the above, this Electoral Institute only approves limits on private financing for militants, supporters and candidates, and not per elected office.
